

I'm a lover of longtime **Tames** Michener's sprawling tomes that are a delicious mix of history, geography, and culture—all brought to life bv adventures of sharply-drawn fictional characters. I'm looking forward to continuing my winter tradition of revisiting at least one of Mr. Michener's absorbing

books. What riches I have to choose from: from Iberia to South Africa to the Caribbean to Hawaii and several locations in the continental United States, and even to space—each book a rich, enjoyable experience. Learning has never been such fun!

This season's first "lesson" will be *Poland*, a fascinating venture into a land that I'd always been aware of, yet I lacked even a

rudimentary understanding of its rich history and captivating culture until Michener opened my eyes to it. As always, Mr. Michener details centuries of intrigue and accomplishments, taking us back to times when the borders of Poland extended far beyond their current boundaries. Who knew that Polish history was deeply intertwined with that of Scandinavia? (Lots of people, I imagine, just not moi!) Anything but dry, this adventure back in time is a fun read populated by riveting characters both real and imagined. Highly recommended!

Q: Do reader reviews really help to sell books? What should I say in a review?

A: For those of us without big marketing budgets and/or publicity departments to get the word out, reader reviews help validate our books for book shoppers who stumble across them, letting them know that others have read a book and enjoyed it (or not).

Part two of the question is about how to write a review. All that's needed is a couple of sentences about why you liked the book: the characters; the plot; suspense and excitement; setting; or something else that kept you turning the pages until late in the night. If you can't decide what to say—there's that dreaded writer block thing you hear about! Horror face—just slap lots and lots of stars in the handy space provided and leave it at that. ③
