Q: What's the hardest part of indie publishing?


A: That's a timely question, and an impossible one to answer definitively. I would give different replies at different stages of the journey, and these would be informed by an individual author's own goals and objectives. I'm going to answer this from the perspective of an indie writer who has been fortunate enough to experience some small measure of success in the grand scheme of things, which is about where I sit on the spectrum of writers. For me, the toughest thing has become the endless effort to keep all the balls in the air: writing, publishing, marketing and advertising. While it would be nice to think that there comes a point where you've worked it all out and can coast a little on your hard-won knowledge and experience, it simply doesn't work that way. The publishing landscape is constantly evolving, forcing us to be nimble as we adapt to the changes. What worked in the spring may not work by summer, and on and on. It isn't for the faint of heart. Finding balance is tricky and burnout is a definite risk. Now that I've made the whole concept sound positively ghastly, there are also substantial rewards to accomplishing a measure of success—people deriving enjoyment from your creation being chief amongst them. Aside from selling any copies, simply completing and publishing a novel is an accomplishment relatively few people manage to do. I guess my point is to go into this with your eyes open. It's a long and difficult road, but one that can be very rewarding.
